Food Waste Energy Plant Opened

he first food waste to energy plant in Australia, at Camellia in western Sydney, was opened on February 25th by NSW Energy Minister, Kim Yeadon.

The \$36 MM facility has a full generation capacity of 3.5 MW, which can power about 3,000 homes, and has been pre-sold to NSW regional energy supplier Country Energy

under a three-year deal. Yeadon said the facility is expected to realise significant long-term environmental and economic benefits for regional and metropolitan energy suppliers and the broader community.

It is owned by Earthpower Technologies Sydney, a 91% owned subsidiary of Environmental Infrastructure Limited.
