CALVIN CHIMENE—*Biographical Sketch*



Calvin Chimene was born in Houston in 1927 and graduated from the University of Texas in 1950 with a Bachelor of Science in geology. He completed his Master's degree in geology at the University of Houston in 1952. Chimene worked for Sohio Petroleum Co. from 1952 to 1963. After a brief stint at American Natural Gas Co., he worked for Austral

Oil from 1964 to 1974. He was exploration manager for Total in the late 70's and a vice president of Florida Exploration

Co. from 1980 to 1985. Since 1985, he has served as president of Laahnz Corp. Chimene is a member of HGS, AIPG, SEPM and SEG. He has presented talks to the HGS, Friends of the Mesozoic, AAPG and the U of H Geological Alumni Association.

Many papers have been written on this 1968 Smackover discovery because of the abundance of available core data. This has resulted in a number of different ideas about the origin of the field. A historical review will help one to understand previous interpretational problems.

The present study incorporates previously unpublished data, and calls for an adjusted interpretation of the structural framework of the field. It also creates an exploration concept for the trend. Faulting in the area is discussed, along with possible resolutions of some past controversies.
