New South Australian Exploration Initiative

The SA government fully recognises that its mineral resources have the potential to make a significant contribution to the state's future growth. The government intends to work closely with industry and community groups to ensure that this potential is fully realised. Investment in the Targeted Exploration Initiative South Australia (TIESA) is a clear example of this commitment. The total initial commitment is \$3.19 million for the first year of TEISA.
